**WHEREAS,** the International Codes, the most widely adopted building safety, energy and fire prevention codes in the nation, are used by most U.S. cities, counties and states; these modern building codes also include safeguards to protect the public from natural disasters such as hurricanes, snowstorms, tornadoes, wildland fires and earthquakes, and;

**WHEREAS,** Building Safety Month is sponsored by the International Code Council, to remind the public about the critical role of our communities' largely unknown guardians of public safety – our local code officials – who assure us of safe, efficient and new technologies in the construction industry. Building Safety Month 2014 encourages appropriate steps everyone can take to ensure that places where we live, learn, work, worship and play are safe and sustainable, and recognizes that countless lives have been saved due to the implementation of safety codes by local and state agencies, and;

**WHEREAS,** each year, in observance of Building Safety Month, Americans are asked to consider projects to improve building safety and sustainability at home and in the community, and to acknowledge the essential service provided to all of us by local and state building departments, fire prevention bureaus and federal agencies in protecting lives and property.

# LUPUS AWARENESS MONTH 2014 TOWN OF EDISTO BEACH PROCLAMATION

Declaring the month of May "Lupus Awareness Month" in the Town of Edisto Beach, SC.

**WHEREAS,** Lupus is a chronic, autoimmune disease that can damage any part of the body (skin, joints, and/or organs inside the body) by the autoimmune system producing antibodies to cells within the body leading to widespread inflammation and tissue damage in belief that something is wrong – this is the part of the body that fights off viruses, bacteria, and germs; and

**WHEREAS,** approximately 1.5 million people in the United States are living with Lupus, 90 percent of people diagnosed with the disease are women in childbearing years, and as many as 1 in 250 people may develop Lupus; and

**WHEREAS,** The Town of Edisto Beach calls attention to the need for people locally, across South Carolina and around the world to unite in support of individuals, families, friends and communities affected by this disease financially, physically, socially, and emotionally and to renew our commitment to finding a cure and improving the well-being and quality of life; and

**WHEREAS,** The Town of Edisto Beach proudly supports Crowning Lupus LLC, by participating in and promoting the observations of the 2014 theme, "Give Lupus Royal Treatment"; and

**WHEREAS,** Lupus Awareness Day encourages all citizens to learn more about Lupus and the four different types – Systemic Lupus Erythematosus (SLE); Disoid Lupus (skin only); Drug-Induced Lupus (temporary) and Neonatal Lupus (occurs at birth, infant eventually grows out of it) – and to work together to raise awareness of this silent epidemic and treatment of Lupus amont the residents of our city, state and around the world.

#### AN ORDINANCE

#### TO AMEND SECTION 82-33 OF THE TOWN'S CODE

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Edisto Beach, South Carolina, in Council duly assembled that Section 82-33 of the Town's Code be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 82-33. Rates and regulations.

- (a) Each residence or other building which is located within 100 feet of any water main shall be connected thereto and shall utilize the same for water purposes. Such connection shall be forthwith made; and for the purposes of the penal provisions of this article, each day during which such building shall not be connected to such water main shall be a separate offense and punishable as provided in this article.
- (b) Until changed pursuant to appropriate action of the council, the following shall be the schedule of semi-annual rates or charges for the water services afforded by the waterworks system:

## TO AMEND SECTION 82-139 OF THE TOWN'S CODE.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Edisto Beach, South Carolina, in council duly assembled that Section 82-139 of the Town's Code be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 82-139. Sewer rates.

(a) Until changed pursuant to appropriate action of the council, the following shall be the schedule of rates or charges for the sewer services afforded by the town sewage works: TABLE INSET:

Gallons	Rate per billing cycle
06,000, semi-annual, minimum	\$208.37
Over 6,000, semi-annual, per 1,000	\$3.47

(b) The minimum fee would be billed in semi-annual billing cycles in advance for the period beginning June 1 and for the period beginning December 1. Sewage use in excess of the minimum is billed in arrearage for the period ending May 31 and the period ending November 30 respectively.

## **Fair Housing Resolution**

**WHEREAS**, April 12, 2014 marks the 46<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the passage of the U.S. Fair Housing Law, Title VIII of the Civil Rights act of 1968, as amended, and the State of South Carolina enacted the South Carolina Fair Housing Law in 1989, that both support the policy of Fair Housing without regard to race, color, creed, national origin, sex, familial status, and handicap, and encourages fair housing opportunities for all citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Edisto Beach is committed, to addressing discrimination in our community, to support programs that will educate the public about the right to equal housing opportunities, and to plan partnership efforts with other organizations to help assure every citizen of their right to fair housing; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Edisto Beach rejects discrimination on the basis of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, disability and/or familial status in the sale, rental, or provision of other housing services; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Edisto Beach desires that all its citizens be afforded the opportunity to attain decent, safe and sound living environment;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved that the Town of Edisto Beach does hereby designate April 2014 as being Fair Housing Month and, the Town of Edisto Beach recognizes the policy supporting Fair Housing in encouraging all citizens to endorse Fair Housing opportunities for all not only during Fair Housing month but throughout the year.
