

## ...Significant Severe Weather Event Possible Thursday...

### **OVERVIEW:**

A strong cold front will sweep through the region late Thursday bringing a threat of severe thunderstorms during the afternoon and early evening across southeast South Carolina and southeast Georgia. The Storm Prediction Center has highlighted much of the area within a "Moderate Risk" for severe weather.

### TIMING

- Severe Thunderstorms:
  - I PM to 6 PM Thursday across inland areas, mainly west of I-95.
  - 3 PM to 8 PM Thursday across coastal areas, mainly east of I-95.

# HAZARDS & IMPACTS

- Severe Thunderstorms:
  - Damaging Winds: Wind gusts in excess of 58 mph could down trees and power lines and cause some structural damage and power outages.
  - Tornadoes: A few strong tornadoes (EF2 or greater) are possible.
  - Large Hail: I+ inch diameter hail could result in damage to vehicles and sensitive vegetation.
