

## ...Significant Severe Weather Event Possible Thursday...

### OVERVIEW:

A strong cold front will sweep through the region late Thursday bringing a threat of severe thunderstorms during the afternoon and early evening across southeast South Carolina and southeast Georgia. The Storm Prediction Center has highlighted much of the area within a “[Moderate Risk](#)” for severe weather.

<b>TIMING</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Severe Thunderstorms:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1 PM to 6 PM Thursday across inland areas, mainly west of I-95.</li> <li>3 PM to 8 PM Thursday across coastal areas, mainly east of I-95.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<b>HAZARDS &amp; IMPACTS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Severe Thunderstorms:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Damaging Winds: Wind gusts in excess of 58 mph could down trees and power lines and cause some structural damage and power outages.</li> <li>Tornadoes: A few strong tornadoes (EF2 or greater) are possible.</li> <li>Large Hail: 1+ inch diameter hail could result in damage to vehicles and sensitive vegetation.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
