#### Summer Safety Tips

Summer break is fast approaching, and we are asking community members and visitors to be mindful of the distractions and hazards that often accompany the vacation season. Please keep the following safety tips in mind.

- Secure valuables to help prevent theft. This includes items stored under houses and in vehicles. If anything looks out of the ordinary, dial 911 for emergencies, or dial (843)549-2211 for the Colleton County Dispatch non-emergency line.
- Plan accordingly as per the weather forecast and the tide chart while out enjoying any water-based activities to help avoid any incidents. An updated tide chart and information regarding rip currents are located HERE.
- While operating a motor vehicle, be mindful of pedestrians and bicyclists as our beach town and the island becomes busier.
- Bicyclists are required to obey traffic laws while on the roadway. Some of the most common violations by bicyclists are not stopping at stop signs, not using lights at night, and not keeping to the right with the flow of traffic. Bicyclists must also yield right-of-way to foot traffic if riding on the sidewalk. The bike path is a great way to explore the Town while avoiding traffic.
- Pedestrians are required to walk on the sidewalk or on the shoulder of the road against the flow of traffic when a sidewalk is not present. Be cautious and courteous.

# **April Town Council Meeting Highlights**

At the regular monthly Town Council meeting on April 13th, Council approved the following items:

- Second Reading of Ordinance 2023-03, Adoption of the 2023 Comprehensive Plan, a ten-year plan approved by the Planning Commission after months of dedicated work in producing and approving this document. The document will be available on our website in the coming days.
- First reading of Ordinance 2023-07 to amend Section 82-139 of the Town Code to adjust the rates for sewer service.
- First Reading of Ordinance 2023-09 to amend Section 66-8(c) of the Town Code to adjust the rates for solid waste service.
- The approval of several special event requests, including:

- Edisto Beach Baptist Church Concert on July 1 at Bay Creek Park

## **Reminder: Protect our Loggerhead Sea Turtles**

In order to protect our loggerhead turtles, please remember to turn off all lights on the beach at dusk beginning May 1st through October 31st, as well as:

- close all drapes if lights are visible on the beach
- fill in holes or castle moats at dusk
- keep dogs on a leash from May through November
- stay away from nesting turtles, turtle nests, and turtle hatchings
