

Drainage Studies - Update from Engineers

At a Town Council Informational Session held on November 10, engineers from Davis & Floyd presented two studies: one on Town-wide drainage and the other on the Yacht Club Road drainage. Several residents attended this meeting and asked questions.

The Town currently has an application submitted to FEMA for funding to implement recommended improvements from the Interior Lagoon Study. The Town has also submitted federal and state earmark requests and is pursuing additional funding opportunities, including Colleton County Transportation Committee funding.





Update on Town Projects

Emergency Operations Center/Town Hall: The construction for the Emergency Operations Center/Town Hall is progressing and on schedule, with an anticipated completion date of March 2026.



Wastewater Treatment Plant Upgrades: The Wastewater Treatment Plant upgrades, funded by the SCIIP grant, are also on schedule. The lift stations are being installed, with the Pompano lift station completed, and the Waterfront lift station near completion. The upgrades to the treatment plant are continuing, and a temporary water treatment plant is currently being brought online. All projects associated with the SCIIP grant are projected to be completed by May 2026.

Advanced Metering Infrastructure: The Automated Metering Infrastructure project is moving along, with old meters being removed and new meters taking their place. Town Hall staff are being trained on the software associated with the automated readers. This project is slated to be completed in 2026.

Beach Nourishment Project: Work continues in partnership with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on the beach nourishment project. Town Council and staff are working diligently to resolve the remaining real-estate-related matters associated with the project appraisals. Ensuring this project becomes a reality—and that the much-needed beach nourishment is completed next year—remains one of the Town's highest priorities.

November 13, 2025 Council Meeting

At the regular monthly Town Council meeting held on November 13, 2025, the following items were approved by Council:

- As per Town Ordinance, following a general election for Town Council, a Mayor Pro Tempore shall be elected by ballot from the Town Council. The Mayor Pro Tempore shall serve a term of two years or until a successor is elected. Council Member Jerome Kizer was approved by Town Council to serve as Mayor Pro Tempore.
- Second Reading of Ordinance 2025-13, Amendment to Standardize Business License Class Schedule was approved.
- As recommended by the ATAX Board, \$250,000 for the Beach Nourishment Project was approved.
- Council approved the following three individuals to serve on the TIDE Committee: Allen Bridwell, Edye Graves, and Lisa White.
- Council approved the readvertisement of one (1) vacancy on the Planning Commission for an unexpired term to May 31, 2027. Deadline date for applications is December 3.
- Due to the need for traffic studies and other considerations, Council decided not to take any action on a recommendation from the TIDE Committee to reduce the speed limit to 20 mph on Jungle Shores Drive and other unpaved roads.
- Special Event Application for a fundraiser for the family of John Singleton at Pressley's at the Marina on November 15, 2025, from 11:00 a.m. - 11:00 p.m. was approved.

Oath of Office for Newly Elected Council Members

Bob Renner and Jay Watts were reelected to the Town Council, and the Oath of Office was administered to both individuals at the November 13 Town Council meeting by Municipal Judge Tom Hart III.

Both Mr. Renner and Mr. Watts will serve four-year terms.
