#### Reminder: New SC Golf Cart Law

As we end June's Golf Cart Safety Month, please note a new South Carolina golf cart law was signed by the Governor in May. While the Town is still working on specifics regarding this new law, the most important item people must abide by is the seat belt requirement for children under the age of 12 years old. At the July monthly meeting, Town Council will consider the first reading of an ordinance which includes the specifics of the new law.



## Burley L. Lyons Park Improvement Project

As the Town shared on June 20, the Burley L. Lyons Park Project is on hold while a resident's appeal is heard in the State of South Carolina Administrative Law Court. The appeal alleges this project was not properly advertised by the contractor and the SC Department of Environmental Services.

This project involves adding a boardwalk along the existing, well-worn, and utilized foot path leading to a 200 square foot community dock. According to public records, there are more than 10 private docks on the lake, several of which are at or larger than 200 square feet.

As per Town Council action, the project was sent to the TIDE Committee for possible recommendations regarding location and configuration change. The TIDE Committee discussed this matter at the June 4 meeting, and a few residents were present to express their views on the proposed dock, both in support and opposition to the project. The TIDE Committee, however, will not offer recommendations to Town Council until the appeal matter is resolved.

## **Fire Safe Community Recognition**

At the 2025 Fire-Rescue Annual Conference in Myrtle Beach on June 13, the Edisto Beach Fire Department was one of 207 fire departments across the state that received the 2024 Fire Safe Community Designation. Chief Denney Conley attended the conference and received the Town's certificate.

The Edisto Beach Fire Department and Volunteer Fire Department work to reduce home fire-related injuries by promoting consistent fire and safety messaging and by stressing the need for all members of the community to be educated in fire safety, which decreases the risk for both residents and firefighters.

In order to earn Community Designation, the EBFD completed courses to increase the department's Community Risk Reduction efforts, documented opportunities for public education, and worked with partners to address risks.

Partners in Fire Safe SC include the SC State Firefighters' Association, the SC Association of Fire Chiefs, the SC Fire Marshal Association, among others.

## **McConkey Square Project Completed**

On May 30, Town Council approved an emergency procurement to install riprap along McConkey Square in order to deal with a serious erosion issue along the outfall. The project was completed in late-June.



## June 12, 2025 Council Meeting

At the regular monthly Town Council meeting held on June 12, 2025, the following items were approved by Council:

- Second Reading of Ordinance 2025-09 to Adopt the Fiscal Year 2025-2026 Budget. The projected fiscal year 2025-2026 revenue and projected expenditures are at \$11,933,672. The millage will remain at the current 30.17 mills for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.
- Agreement with SCDOT for the Transportation Alternatives Program Bike Path Improvement Project, Phase I, \$600,000. This phase preliminary consists of the engineering, design, and right-of-way needed for the widening of the existing bike paths along Docksite Road, Yacht Club Road, Edisto Street, and Lee Street, and the construction of approximately 150 linear feet of new path on Lee Street.
- Bid for Jungle Shores Bike Path Repaving Project, \$136,712.42. This bid was awarded to Truluck Roadway Services, LLC, for the repaving of approximately 4,352 linear feet of a 5-foot-wide asphalt bike path.
- Charles Ned Kuntz approved for a sixyear term to serve on the Municipal Election Commission.
- Special Event Applications, including:
  - Hackett Family 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade with set-up at 9 a.m. and the parade at 10 a.m. from Mikell to Neptune Streets along Myrtle Street.
  - Edisto Beach Shag Festival: August 29-30, 2025, from 12 noon to 10 p.m., at Bay Creek Park.
  - SC Triathlon Series: November 1, 2025, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.
