2026 Predicted King Tides

As per the SC King Tides Initiative, "King Tide" is a non-scientific term often used to describe exceptionally high tides, which typically occur during a new or full moon and when the moon is at perigee, or during specific seasons around the country.

NOAA develops annual astronomical tide predictions at over 200 locations in South Carolina. Please note water levels may, however, exceed predicted heights due to precipitation, onshore winds, and other short-term meteorological events.

The predicted 2026 King Tides schedule is as follows:

- April 18
- May 15-18
- June 14-16
- July 13-14
- August 11-12
- October 10-11; 26-29
- November 24-27

December 11, 2025 Council Meeting

At the regular monthly Town Council meeting held on December 11, 2025, the following items were approved by Council:
