EDISTO RECIPES



Shrimp Alfredo

12 oz penne pasta ¼ cup butter
2 Tbsp. olive oil
1 diced onion
2 cloves minced garlic
1 diced bell pepper
½ pound mushrooms diced
1 pound peeled & deveined shrimp
1 jar Alfredo sauce
½ cup grated parmesan cheese
½ cup heavy cream
Salt & pepper to taste

Boil pasta per instructions on package. Melt butter with oil in saucepan and cook onion till softened. Stir in garlic, bell pepper and mushrooms and cook until soft. Stir in the shrimp and cook until pink, then add alfredo sauce, cheese and cream. Bring to a light boil and stir until thickened, then add pasta and season with salt and pepper to taste. Enjoy!

MINUTES July 13, 2016 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING 6:00 P.M.

Present: Jane S. Darby, Mayor, Susan Hornsby, Mayor Pro Tempore, Jerome Kizer, Crawford Moore, and Patti Smyer, Council Members; *Quorum of Council Present.*

Mayor Darby called the meeting to order and Councilman Moore led those in attendance in an invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the minutes of the Public Hearing held on June 27, 2016, seconded by Councilman Moore. The motion was unanimously approved.

Councilman Moore moved to approve the minutes of the Special Council Meeting on June 27, 2016, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby and approved unanimously.

Proclamations and Presentations

Sara Simpson was recognized for her work in making the utility bills easier to decipher by highlighting the amount due on the postcards.

Billy Callahan, Slade Evans and Robert Griffin were recognized for work done on the Civic Center.

Walton Salley was recognized for her service on the ATAX Board.

Mayor Darby presented Chief George Brothers with gift certificates to Waterfront for all officers in his department from Weezie Fickling as a "thank you" for their continued exemplary work.

New Business/Appearances

- A. Memorandum of Agreement for the provision of secure detention services with the Department of Juvenile Justice Detention Center for FY2016-2017 Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby moved to approve the Memorandum of Agreement and to authorize the Town Administrator to execute said agreement. The motion was seconded by Councilman Kizer and approved unanimously.
- **B.** Boil Water Notice Policy Councilman Moore moved to approve the Boil Water Policy, which provides guidance regarding when boil water notices will be issued by the Town. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Smyer and unanimously approved.
- C. Special Event Application 2016 Edisto Billfish Invitational Tournament The 2016 Edisto Billfish Invitational Tournament will be held July 20 23 at Bay Creek Park and the Marina at Edisto Beach. There will be live music daily from 5 9 p.m. and food will be sold by Pressleys. Councilman Kizer moved to approve the Special Event Application, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby and approved unanimously.
- D. Emergency Operations Plan and HurricanePlan The plan is updated annually and requires

Council input and approval. Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby moved to approve the Emergency Operations and Hurricane Plan, seconded by Councilman Moore and approved unanimously.

- E. Grant between South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control and the Town of Edisto Beach - This grant provides funding to repair or rebuild up to seven wooden walkover ramps in the amount of \$24,750. The walkovers are located at Lybrand, Mitchell, Edings, Mikell, Louise and Ebb Tide Streets and at the end of Yacht Club Road. The Town's match is \$24,750 from Hospitality Funds. The Town will perform the work based on priority order. The Town anticipates this grant will not cover the costs to repair or rebuild all of the wooden walkover ramps listed. Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the Grant between the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control and the Town of Edisto Beach and authorize the Town Administrator to execute said agreement. Councilman Kizer seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.
- **F. Burley L. Lyons Park** Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby moved to defer this agenda item until August 2016 when further information would be provided. The motion was seconded by Councilman Moore and unanimously approved.
- **G.** Booster Pump No. 1 Motor Emergency Purchase After the Town made repairs to the seals on Booster Pump No. 1 and the pump was reinstalled and pressurized, the contractor determined the motor was not functioning correctly. Councilman Moore moved to approve the Emergency Purchase for the Booster Pump No. 1 motor in the amount of \$5,040.00 to be funded from water fund system maintenance and repair. Councilman Kizer seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.
- Special Event Application Music and Shag Festival - Mr. Darrin Moore has submitted a special event application for the Music and Shag Fest to be held September 2, 2016, through September 4, 2016, at Bay Creek Park between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. Mr. Moore is also requesting Council provide a \$12,000 sponsorship. Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby moved to approve a \$10,000 sponsorship and to waive the park fees. The motion was seconded by Councilman Moore and approved unanimously. Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby then amended her motion to include the fees being paid from the Alcohol The motion was seconded by Permit fund. Councilwoman Smyer and unanimously approved.

- I. Retention Building Air Conditioner Councilman Kizer moved to approve the purchase of a new air conditioner unit for \$5,300 from the FY2015-16 general fund miscellaneous expense fund to replace the current unit. Councilwoman Smyer seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.
- J. Cameras for Convenience Center Councilman Moore moved to approve the transfer of \$3,686.00 from General Fund Contingency to General Fund CIP Miscellaneous for the purchase of two cameras from TSC Technology Solutions of Charleston as a sole source provider for the convenience station. Councilman Kizer seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.
- K. Coastal Science and Engineering Edisto **Beach Stabilization Project - Phase 2 - Mayor** Pro Tem Hornsby moved to approve Phase 2 at a cost not to exceed \$736,188 to be paid from beach nourishment funds. The State Park, Recreation and Tourism portion is \$103,066 and is to be reimbursed to the Town. Town cost for Phase 2 is \$633,122. Councilwoman Smyer seconded the motion. Steven Traynum of CSE updated those in attendance and Council on the status of the Edisto Beach project. Mr. Traynum said that the permitting process and preliminary design process are nearing completion. In order to build the project in the upcoming winter construction window, now is the time to start the final design process. To date, the state permit is in hand and the Army Corps of Engineers is finishing their decision document. Phase two will include the final design and an updated survey. This survey will also serve as the annual monitoring survey that is done every year. Also included in phase two will be the final design which will have the updated volumes and fill templates for the nourishment portion of the project. completed groin designs will be included in phase two. There will be a final opinion of construction costs and a timeline of the construction. The permit allows for construction to start any time after November 1, 2016. Mayor Darby thanked Mr. Travnum and called for the vote and the motion was approved unanimously.

Committee Vacancies

A. Zoning Board of Appeals – Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the advertising of two vacancies to occur on the Zoning Board of Appeals. The terms of Mr. William Davies and Mr. John McAlhany will expire on September 1, 2016. Councilman Moore seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

B. Accommodations Tax Advisory Board – There are two vacancies on the ATAX Board, both in the Hospitality/Lodging sector. Applications have been received from Leslie Varner-Hurley and Pieter Knot. Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the two applications, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby and unanimously approved.

Planning Commission

A. Phillip Albenesius – Charter Boat Tours – Councilman Kizer moved to approve the unanimous recommendation from the Planning Commission that Mr. Phillip Albenesius be granted a permit to operate a charter boat tour business from the Marina at Edisto Beach. Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

During the first ten days of July, 9,432,550 gallons of water were pumped by the Town. The average daily usage was 943,255 gallons. On July 4th, the Town pumped 1,106,200 gallons. Mayor Darby asked Mr. Doub, "What would be your recommendation to solve that?" Mr. Doub responded, in part "The system needs serious, serious attention. And it's going to take serious, serious money." Mayor Darby asked that the August agenda include a discussion "for the Council to look seriously at the water situation as recommended by Mr. Doub, and come up with a plan of how to move forward."
