# RENTING YOUR EDISTO BEACH VACATION HOME?

An annual rental business license is required if you receive rental income from your property. The license is required whether property is for rent by

owner or if rented through a rental agency. Your agency does not automatically pay this fee for you, so please check with your agency or Town Hall to obtain an application.

Applications are based on the calendar year and expire December 31 each year.

Also, the Town collects a Local Accommodations Tax Fee for short term rentals; contact Town Hall for details.

# EDISTO RECIPES

### **NEW YEAR'S DAY BLACK-EYED PEAS**

Remember, black-eyed peas on New Year's Day brings good luck the entire year!

1 pound dry black-eyed peas 2 cups chopped cooked ham Salt and pepper to taste 1 pinch garlic powder 2 onions, diced Place black-eyed peas in an 8-quard pot. Add enough water to fill pot ¾ full. Stir in ham and diced onions, and season with salt, pepper and garlic powder. Place tomatoes in a blender or food processor, and blend until the tomatoes are liquefied. Add tomatoes to pot. Bring all ingredients to a boil. Cover the pot, and simmer on low heat for 2 ½ to 3 hours, or until the peas are tender.

Present: Jane S. Darby, Mayor, Crawford Moore, Mayor Pro Tempore, Susan Hornsby, Jerome Kizer, and Patti Smyer, Council Members; *Quorum of Council Present*.

Mayor Pro Tem Moore led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance and an invocation.

# **Approval of Minutes**

- A. Special Council Meeting Minutes, October 9, 2018 Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the minutes of the special Council Meeting on October 9, 2018, seconded by Councilwoman Hornsby and unanimously approved.
- **B.** Regular Council Meeting Minutes, October 11, 2018 Councilman Kizer moved to approve the minutes of the regular Council Meeting on October 11, 2918, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Hornsby and unanimously approved.

# **Proclamations and Presentations**

A. Town of Edisto Beach Police Department Certificate of Appreciation – Gloria Zeller, Secretary of the Edisto Beach Loggerhead Turtle Project, presented Police Chief George Brothers with a certificate and thanked him and his department for their assistance with lighting and other issues during the summer of 2018. A donation of \$2,100 will be made to the Sea Turtle Care Center in honor of the Edisto Beach Police Department.

#### **Old Business**

- A. Second Reading of Ordinance No. 2018-24 to Amend Section 42-46(e) and Adopt Section 42-46(f) and (g) of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Edisto Beach relating to the Fire Department Mayor Pro Tem Moore moved to approve second reading of Ordinance No. 2018-24 which is necessary to comply with the state code relating to the Fire Department. Councilwoman Hornsby seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.
- B. Second Reading of Ordinance No. 2018-25 to Enact Section 58-139 of the Town's Code of Ordinances Related to Indecent Exposure and Displays of Specified Anatomical Areas on the Beach and Within Certain Areas of the Town;

and to Repeal Section 10-41 Related to the Same Subject – Councilman Kizer moved to approve the second reading of Ordinance No. 2018-25 to Enact Section 58-139 of the Town's Code of Ordinances Related to Indecent Exposure and Displays of Specified Anatomical Areas on the Beach and Within Certain Areas of the Town and to Repeal Section 10-41 related to the same subject. These revisions address recent changes to the state code. Mayor Pro Tem Moore seconded the motion which was unanimously approved.

#### **New Business**

- **A. 2019 Meetings and Holidays Schedule** Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the 2019 meetings and holidays schedule. Councilwoman Hornsby seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.
- **B. 2019 Annual Goal Setting Retreat** Councilman Kizer moved to approve holding the 2019 Goal Setting Retreat on Thursday, January 31, 2019 beginning at 10:00 a.m. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Hornsby and unanimously approved.
- C. No Cost Budget Adjustment to Edisto Beach Stabilization Project Phase 2 Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the no cost budget adjustment to the Edisto Beach Stabilization Project Phase 2 with Coastal Science and Engineering, seconded by Councilwoman Hornsby and approved unanimously.
- **D.** Amendment #1 for Professional Services 2018 Post-Storm Beach Monitoring Survey Hurricane Florence Councilwoman Hornsby moved to approve Amendment #1 for Professional services for Hurricane Florence at a cost not to exceed \$11,000 to be paid from the local accommodations fund. Monitoring is required per the Town's permit and to qualify for federal funding, if available. Mayor Pro Tem Moore seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.
- E. Amendment #2 for Professional Services 2018 Post-Storm Beach Monitoring Survey Hurricane Michael Mayor Pro Tem Moore moved to approve Amendment #2 for professional services for Hurricane Michael at a cost not to exceed \$11,000 to be paid from the local accommodations fund. Monitoring is required per the Town's permit and to qualify for federal funding, if available. Councilwoman Smyer seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.
- **F. Immigration Compliance Reporting** Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the Immigration Compliance Reporting Form, which is necessary for publication of the Immigration Compliance Report. Councilman Kizer seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.
- **G.** Recurring Special Event Application, Edisto United, Annual Oysters & BBQ Fundraiser Councilwoman Smyer moved to approve the recurring special event application from Edisto United for the Annual Oysters and BBQ fundraiser to be held on Sunday, December 2, 2018 at Bay Creek Park from 4:00 7:00 p.m. and waive park fees. The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Moore and approved unanimously.
- **H. TIDE Committee Recommendations** Councilman Kizer moved to approve the TIDE Committee recommendations to install rope fencing at the entrance of Jungle Road Park, the gazebo area of Jungle Road Park and Burley L./ Lyons Park. The rope and post fencing should be used by the Town whenever possible to continue the "branding" of Edisto Beach. Administrator Hill provided Council with a cost estimate for moving forward with these recommendations, which is not to

exceed \$5,500 (funded from local accommodations). Mayor Pro Tem Moore seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.

**I.** Award of RFP #2018-14 Groin Repair – Mayor Pro Tem Moore moved to approve awarding RFP #2018-14 Groin Repair to Rakes Building and Maintenance Contractors, LLC dba Blutide Marine Construction for a total cost of \$274,535.86 and authorize the Town Administrator to execute the contract. According to Provisio 100.21, the state will pay the non-federal share which is 25% (\$68,634.72) providing that funding is still available. If funding is not available, the non-federal share will be paid from local accommodations. Councilwoman Hornsby seconded the motion, which was approved unanimously.

# **Committee Vacancies**

**A.** Water and Sewer Committee – 1 vacancy – Councilwoman Hornsby moved to approve the application of Jody Kleckley to serve a second four-year term on the Water and Sewer Committee, seconded by Councilwoman Smyer and unanimously approved.

# **Accommodations Tax Advisory Board**

A. Edisto Chamber of Commerce – Off Season Marketing and Advertising 2018-2019 - \$50,000 – Councilman Kizer moved to approve the unanimous recommendation of the ATAX Board to approve \$50,000 for off season marketing and advertising for the Chamber of Commerce during the 2018-2019 fiscal year. Mayor Pro Tem Moore seconded the motion which was approved unanimously.

**B.** Edisto Beach Police Department, Life Rings, Throw Ropes and Throw Bags - \$2,840 – Mayor Pro Tem Moore moved to approve the unanimous recommendation of the ATAX Board to approve \$2,840 for life rings, throw ropes and throw bags. Councilman Kizer seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved.
