Camera Registration Program

The Town of Edisto Beach Police Department is excited to present their latest program aimed reducing investigation times increasing the likelihood recovering stolen property. Willing residents and businesses encouraged to register the location of their surveillance cameras for the purpose of potentially allowing the Police Department to review footage in the event that a reported crime is recorded on the camera.

Colleton County Capital Project Sales Tax

Edisto Beach residents will gather at the polls on November 8, 2022, to cast their votes on a referendum for the Colleton County Capital Project Sales Tax (CPST). This is an extension of the existing penny sales tax that was approved in 2014 whereby Edisto Beach received \$4,000,000 for beach renourishment. This sales tax is a one cent sales and use tax on local sales throughout Colleton County. In April 2021, Colleton County Council renewed the formation of a CPST Commission, which was tasked with ranking proposals for funding capital projects submitted by the various municipalities in Colleton County. Shown to the right is a list of the projects selected for funding if the referendum is approved. The Town's project includes a new Emergency Operations Center and Town Hall. The Town's current facility was constructed in 1985 for a staff of approximately 8-10. The Town now has approximately 38 employees. The lack of Emergency Operations Center became evident after managing response and recovery efforts for six major storms in recent years. In an effort to efficiently utilize the Town's
